Club Chairman John Mills produced a film taken in the New Forest which previewed a new lapel microphone. Another entry was from John Hunt who had filmed the huge and opulent liners which enter Southampton Docks. Sir Paul Holden the club President produced a very good selection of interesting films.

Colin Lewis entered three films, two of which came first and second, winning him the coveted Edit Trophy. His winning film was 'Chico', about an amazing three legged dog, and 'Up, Up and Away', a

colourful film taken aboard a hot air balloon secured him second place.

I have written a play called Sarah's War. It was inspired by a visit to Peter Matthews' boat and conversations with Peter and his wife Janet.


It will be performed in: East Clandon Village Hall on Saturday July 18th GU4

## Video and Cartoons (Filming Bug Moving On)

30 years ago, my enjoyment of film making as a hobby, then designing packaging and promotions for feature film releases for a living, moved on again to include video production when we joined with other creatives as a unit of individual businesses with differing specialisations who would club together on large projects.

We were now designing studio sets, creating props and assisting on camera for corporate projects and a series of ballroom dance training videos featuring world champions, a little slice of show biz!

We were on location with Selina Scott and Frank Bough (remember them?) for a promotion. There was excitement when Noel Edmonds was to present a video and would fly his own helicopter to our studio, landing in an adjacent field. Cameras were ready but he got lost and landed at Fairoaks, Weybridge arriving by taxi!

We had a huge repackaging and promotion campaign when Robinsons Baby Juice (I always thought of it as squeezed babies) transferred from glass jars to Tetrapaks. This involved packaging design, publicity and a video presentation. For the video we were designing, building and dressing a studio set based on the TV-AM studio but for Robinsons it was called Baby-am.


The video featured Anneka Rice, whose famous bum was gracing TV screens for the programme Treasure Hunt. She was heli-hopping around Norfolk strawberry farms while presenter Nick Owen was in the studio discussing the product.

My love of animation was always there but it transferred to business in the form of promotional cartoon character creation. It kept my hand in and was an enjoyable extension to our normal work.

When Robinsons Drinks wanted to do a huge countrywide promotion aimed at children, I had to create a ton of cartoon illustrations and a sticker booklet, Robinsons Book of Amazing Facts.

This lead to an even larger free gift promotion for which I devised a gift book with a story running through it -'Mega Treasure'. I designed a couple of key characters - Jolly Robinson, a Pirate, and his Parrot. This was so successful that my characters were professionally animated for a 20 second TV commercial. An exciting, if somewhat fleeting, brush with animation fame. Then there was Jif Lemon, Cadburys, Waterford Dairies, Rothmans and a host of other clients - all cartoon work.

Film making as a hobby now reverted to recording our daughter growing up and holidays, the real pressure came from the professional side; a tiny sample of the projects are shown here.




